Will County's Earns Cash for Energy Efficiency

Last month ComEd and Nicor gave Will County \$63,000 for extra energy efficiency measures in the design and construction of the new Public Safety Complex and Sheriff's Department. Through its New Construction Program, ComEd awards money to projects that go beyond the Illinois Energy Conservation Code (IECC) requirements. The new Public Safety Complex boasts a number of extra energy-efficient measures, including special energy-efficient insulation in the building's roof and walls; energy efficient



windows and framing (the windows prevent heat from passing through, thus saving on cooling costs). Other measures include using efficient doors, reducing the number of light fixtures, and installing a 93% efficient natural gas boiler.

Wheatland Township FIRST to pass Curbside Referendum

The Will County Solid Waste Plan calls for increased recycling in our unincorporated areas. One of the best ways to increase services and decrease costs to residents is to offer a single collection contract. Wheatland Township (in Plainfield/Naperville area) has become the first township in Will County to put this question to the voters and it PASSED on the March ballot! The township is pleased and has already bid service. Deb Holscher, Township Supervisor, expressed pleasure over the passage as it will reduce



truck traffic, wear on the roadways and provide a higher level of service at a far more economical price!

Time to Collect the Rain

Be prepared for the heat of summer by installing a rain barrel or two in the Spring! During a hard rain, water pours off your roof, across the lawn and into storm sewers. It is unable to soak into the soil. Capturing it in a rain barrel allows you to use it for your garden or lawn later and may help it return to underground aquifers. Also saves you money on watering!



No Clothes or Shoes in the Landfill

Cotton can be recycled many times, polyester is the same as the plastic used to make a 2-liter bottle and nylon is strong enough to withstand several recycling processes. Instead of wasting unwanted clothing and shoes, bring them to be reused or recycled at the **Annual Textile Collection Event**. We accept socks with holes, pants with broken zippers and stained linens! This year, **Savers of Orland Park** is partnering with us to resell the good stuff and recycle the rest!
