Bicycle Trail Expansion

Progress is being made on the Plum Creek Greenway Trail. This is a mostly crushed limestone linear and loop trail and travels 3.15 miles through woodland. Construction at Plum Valley Preserve in Crete is underway and shall add a 1-mile addition to the Plum Creek Greenway Trail. The Forest Preserve anticipates the trail extension being completed by June 2019. Suggested activities include Walking, Biking, Hiking, and Running!

Lockport Township Awards Curbside Contract

Last November the residents of Lockport Township passed a referendum authorizing the Township to provide collection of waste, recycling and landscape materials for all of the unincorporated homes. The County assisted in the procurement process; along with a dedicated group of officials and community members. Homewood Disposal (also known as NuWay) was awarded a 7-year contract in April and will



begin weekly refuse and recycling services on July 1 with 6 weeks of free leaf service in the Fall. Residents expect to save nearly \$40 per month, many receiving curbside recycling and leaf services for the first time!

Will County Gets Lucky in Solar Lottery

On April 10, the Illinois Power Agency (IPA) announced the solar farm projects that would be awarded state incentives to construct. Will County saw 7 solar farms receive incentives. While it is unclear whether or not all chosen projects will choose



to build, Will County feels prepared to see the awarded projects develop.

Recycle Used Razors

This mail back program has a fee but is a partnership between Gillette and Terracycle that offers an alternative to landfilling used "disposable" razors. Businesses, gyms, colleges, cities and community organizations are invited to become public drop-off points if they have the a small budget to dedicate to the shipping costs.

USF Given Grant for Rain Barrels

The University of St. Francis received a grant from American Water for two rain barrels and hoses to improve the sustainability of the garden they created in 2018. Students and faculty grow a variety of food in the garden, donating some to a local food pantry while learning agricultural skills. The grant will allow them to use rain water during dry periods of the season without relying on city supplied water, reducing environmental impacts.
