Plainfield High School Food Scrap Success

This past school year, two Plainfield District High Schools agreed to pilot a food scrap recycling program with guidance from the County's Environmental Educator. Central and East campuses mobilized their environmental clubs and student body to publicize the new program with catchy videos and morning announcements. The kids collected banana peels, apple cores, and half eaten sandwiches, depositing them in containers marked "Food Waste". All unwanted food was hauled to the Organix compost site where it was turned into a soil amendment that fertilizes plants. **Over 4 tons of food was kept out of the waste stream through this program.** District 202 Plainfield is currently negotiating with Organix Recycling to expand the program to include all four of their high schools. RR&E expects to be on hand to help launch the program this Fall.

EV Charging at Walmart

Walmart is the largest brick & mortar retailer in the world and has been "greening" its operations for over a decade, reducing energy use in stores and pushing suppliers to use recycled materials in products and packaging. They have partnered with VW to install 120 Electric Vehicle charging stations in 34 states, starting with stores located near major highways. Each group includes at least one Level 3 high-speed charger. They feature different prices for different charging levels and are adding to the EV fueling grid! Unv Park Garden with Sharefest and County

Faith Movers Church, in University Park, believes providing food, water and, even gasoline, to meet the needs of struggling people is God's will. They began one of the County's most successful "We Will Grow" gardens in 2018 and have doubled the size this year. Rev Ben Chambers leads the effort but a group of six dedicated members of the congregation tend the garden beds. Recent drinking water issues lead the church to offer bottled water for more than a month.



Support Dragonflies - they eat mosquitoes!

There are more than 5,000 species of dragonflies and they were one of the earliest insects to evolve. What makes them the most appealing, besides the fact that they do not pose any harm to humans and have amazing flying skills, is the fact that a single dragonfly can eat 30 to hundreds of mosquitoes per day. Rather than spray your yard or body to keep mosquitoes away, try to cultivate a yard that is dragonfly friendly and they will eat those pests!
