JJC Awarded Grant: EV Study

Joliet Junior College (JJC) has received a \$216,199 grant from the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) as part of the **Rev Up EV! Community College Initiative**. This funding will be allocated to

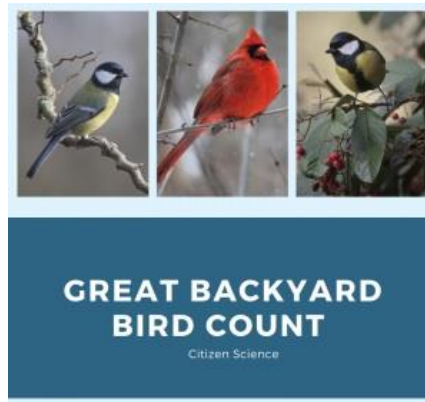


JJC's automotive technology department and enhance its program offerings in electric vehicles. Currently, JJC offers a nine-credit hybrid and electric vehicle specialist certification of completion. The Rev Up EV! grant will allow the department to acquire the necessary equipment to develop a new associate degree in electric vehicle repair. There is also potential for a for-credit certification program focused on charging station maintenance and repair.

New, more affordable EVs

For a long while, the all electric vehicles with the same range of a gasoline powered automobile, were financially inaccessible to the majority of the public. Soon the used EV and Hybrid market made many affordable. However, for the EV-curious US consumers determined to buy brand new, prices of several are now within reach for a greater number of consumers. Carmakers are expected to launch at least 24 all-new, all-battery-powered vehicles in the US this year, representing a nearly 50% increase in the number of models currently on the market. Five of them are slated to start at less than \$50,000.



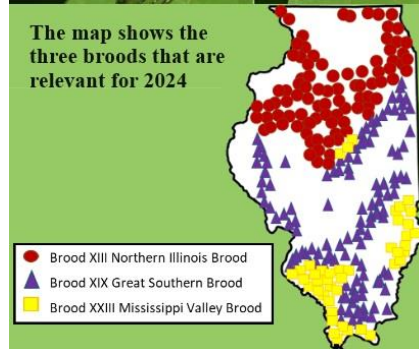
The Cicadas Are Coming

If you are not familiar with cicadas, you may experience some fear this year as we are expected to see not one, but three broods of this long living insect emerge from underground. They do not bite humans or animals and appear not to be a threat to trees where they nibble on leaves. However, they are noisy and, a bit uncoordinated. It is not unusual for people to be startled by them, especially when they shed their exoskeleton, often dropping it from tree limbs.

Think of this as a special year to observe these insects. They spend the vast majority of their lives underground, out of sights, making tunnels and feeding on root systems. This is your chance to see them in action. Enjoy 2024 - the Year of the Cicada!

A recent post about Polystyrene (a.k.a. foam plastic, PS, #6 and the brand name Styrofoam) garnered a lot of attention. Will County offers a collection of this material as part of our bi-annual Recyclepalooza events because DART, a polystyrene manufacturer provides a collection container for us. DART is located in North Aurora and accepts clean cups, egg cartons and more year round but the carbon footprint of driving there is a concern. Comments on the post addressed the need for reuse over recycling. Some people were wondering if egg cartons could be given to farmers with chickens. Bringing your own container for take-out and beverages can make an impact. Great ideas are always welcome.

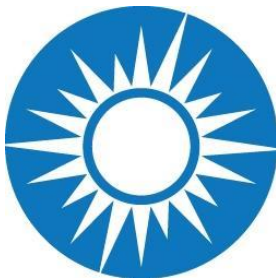
