## **Tips and Alternative Drop-Off Info**





#### Pre-Cycle to Reduce Waste



When shopping, try to "Pre-Cycle." Match the packaging of items you buy with what is currently recyclable. Think about planning meals and buying in bulk when possible. Avoid single-use packaging, such as TV dinners, lunch in trays, K-Cups, and even water bottles.

In the spirit of less waste, bring a **refillable water bottle** wherever you go, shop resale, start a backyard compost pile, and plant a garden to supplement you're packaged foods. Lastly, consider asking an old school butcher to skip the polystyrene and package your meat in paper.

## **YES to Caps on Plastic Bottles and Jugs**

Please put caps back on empty plastic bottles and jugs unless you are participating in a special caps only collection (such as Lewis University is doing to make a plastic picnic table). When caps are tossed into carts separately they fall through the sorting equipment and get swept into the dumpster to go to the landfill. They are usually a different resin type than the bottle but are separated appropriately at their next stop, where the plastic bottle bale is broken, cut and washed.



## What happened to bagging shredded paper?

As automation has increased, the paper bags of shredded paper have been breaking and this means little to no shredded paper makes it to the baling portion of the Material Recovery Facility (MRF). The best advice, only shred at home if you truly fear identity theft of your social security, credit card or bank numbers.

Keep in mind that these numbers are seldom listed on documents to prevent theft. Also, most credit card theft occurs at the point of purchase, not at your curb. If you must shred, wait for a shredding event or take items to retailers that will shred them for a fee. When a truck load of shredded of paper is created, it is baled and sent to a paper mill directly, never going through the typical MRF that processes traditional papers, bottles and cans.



# **Don't Use Plastic Bags for Recyclables**

Plastic bags can be recycled but NOT curbside and not in County traditional drop-off sites. When a MRF receives plastic bags they become tangled in the equipment, causing numerous shut downs and labor intensive removal. Recycling creates jobs but including items that are not recyclable or not able to be processed causes recycling to become more costly than landfilling, resulting in program failures and a net loss of both jobs and our natural resources.

Recycle Right! Return plastic bags to retail outlets to be recovered in a clean, single steam. Retailers usually bale them on-site and they never go to a MRF. They become plastic lumber, picnic benches and more, with long, graffiti resistant lives! BONUS: They also accept bread



bags, plastic produce bags, toilet paper plastic wrap and similar bags!

## No Wires, Cords, Chains in the Cart

We are happy to accept wires and cords at the Electronic recycling drop-off locations but they tangle the equipment at the MRF and usually don't make it to the next recycling step. Please tell friends and family that not everything that is recyclable can be placed in curbside carts and public traditional recycling dumpsters. Scrap metal yards accept these items and Will County offers at least one annual collection event for scrap metal. (Reusable hangers can be donated to thrift stores.)



## Donate Clothing (and toys, furniture, etc)

Across the state of Illinois MRFs are telling us they have people placing clothing in their recycling carts. There seems to be confusion that these items will get reused or recycled this way but they will only go to the landfill in a longer, more expensive manner. PLEASE, donate your clothes to a local thrift store or organization. Will County offers an annual "Textile Collection Event" where we accept clothes and shoes in any condition. These really do get reused (and recycled if not usable). See you in May!



## **CLOSE THE LOOP - BUY RECYCLED**

Will County often gives away pencils made from jeans and chip clips made from recycled plastic bottles. Everyday there are items we can purchase made from recycled items including printer paper, shoes, backpacks, file folders, pens, clipboards, and much more! Ask stores and suppliers for recycled content



options! This keeps recycling strong while also saving resources and conserving energy!
