Please Recycle Paper (at your desk):

- (\$) White & Colored Office Paper (staples are okay but save the paper clips for reuse)
- Stationary, Letterhead or Greeting Cards
- S Junk Mail & Envelopes (with or without windows)
- S Post-It Notes
- Shredded Paper
- (F) Worn or Tattered Manila Folders (reuse the one in good shape)
- Worn or Tattered Interoffice Envelopes
- Softbound Outdated Reports
- S Newspaper, Magazines, Catalogs & Outdated Telephone Books
- Paperboard / Chipboard (tissue boxes, supply item boxes)
- Frozen Food boxes
- S Corrugated Cardboard boxes (please flatten)
- Paper Wrap (from a ream of copy paper excessively waxy covers are NOT accepted)
- Unsoiled Paper Lunch Bags

Please Recycle (in break areas):



- Aluminum Cans (empty liquid before placing in the bin)
- Soup & Coffee Cans
- Glass Bottles
- Plastic Bottles



Recycled paper uses 55% less water, reduces water pollution by 35%, reduces air pollution by 74%, and

Please Discard (these items contaminate the recycling process)

- Plastic Report Covers
- Plastic Ring Bindings (remove from report, the paper can then be recycled)
- Paper or Paperboard contaminated by food
- Used tissues, paper towels, napkins, etc.
- Carbon Paper
- Photographs
- Hanging File Folders (remove metal hangers, folder can then be recycled)
- Plastic Wrap

Everyone uses items made from recycled paper everyday, from newspaper to tissues and much more!
