### Valley View Goes SOLAR!

Installation of solar panels designed to provide energy to five Valley View School District 365U schools began in May with Lukancic Middle School in Romeoville to start. Plans call for installation of solar panels on the roofs of Lukancic and four Bolingbrook schools: Jane Addams, Humphrey, B.J. Ward and Jamie McGee by end of June. The \$5.27 million project is



funded through a lease arrangement that will more than pay for itself in utility cost savings right from the beginning. **Officials estimate over \$9.2 million in cost savings over the next 25 years.** The solar panels, which are extremely reliable and carry a 25-year guarantee, are compatible with the roof structure at all five schools. When completed, the **power generated through the solar panel arrays will provide more than half of the electricity usage in the five schools, including an estimated 72% at Ward and 70% at Humphrey.** 

### **Recycle More Plastics with the Lid!**

Everyone seems to know they can recycle #1 PET and #2 HDPE plastic bottles. However, many are unaware that #5 PP (abbreviation for Polypropylene) may also be recycled in your curbside service or at one of the County Partnership Recycling Drop-Offs. Simply wipe them out with a sponge or paper napkin, put the lid back on and drop them in your recycling container. While it won't be recycled into a food container again, it may become a garbage or recycling cart, water filtration system, shipping pallet, or automotive battery casing, to name a few!



### **Electronics Recycling Getting Easier**

Channahon Township, a former Electronics Recycling partner had to close under the terms of the new program but never gave up! Over the past few months, they worked out an agreement with the Families of Faith Church to become a recurring electronics collection site with support from Township staff and the County's contractor, A-Team



Recyclers. They will regularly scheduled the first and third Thursday of each month, beginnning on **June 15 from 5pm-7pm**. The address is **24466 W. Eames / Rt. 6 in Channahon**. This makes the 6th location offering year round recycling!

## **Groundbreaking Metra Station in Romeoville**

Planning began in 2008 for a Romeoville Metra Station near the Citgo Refinery to serve Will County residents on the Heritage Corridor. 600 parking spaces will make commuting easier, reducing fossil fuel use and congestion. Grants from the state and federal governments will enhance the pedestrian and bicycling options.



### **Opt Out of Receiving Phone Books**

If you receive a phone book and don't want it, be sure to recycle it. They are accepted in all curbside programs and in all the County partnership traditional drop-offs. Even better than recycling is reducing and this can be done by opting out of receiving it.

1. Visit the Yellow Pages Opt Out website

- 2. Enter zip code and create an account
- 3. After completing registration, click "opt out of or order directories"
- 4. Choose "opt out of all" option, then "save changes" and hit CONFIRM.

For every 100 unwanted phone books removed from printing and distribution cuts greenhouse gas emissions equal to nearly 2,000 miles driven by a passenger vehicle!
