#### Will County Honored by Dept. of Energy!

On May 7, Will County was recognized by the U.S. Department of Energy for its achievements in the Better Buildings Challenge and for reducing energy intensity by 2.5% percent across its entire building portfolio for 2013

bringing total saving to 15.5%. The announcement was made at the first National Better Buildings Summit on May 8, along with the release of second year accomplishments and results. Better Buildings Challenge Partners are demonstrating progress to achieve 20 percent energy savings in ten years, with annual energy savings of 2.5 percent or \$300 million.

The Better Buildings Challenge is a national leadership initiative launched by President Obama in 2011 with the goal of making American commercial, multifamily and industrial buildings 20 percent more energy efficient in ten years. The Better Buildings Challenge supports President Obama's broader goal of doubling American energy productivity by 2030 while motivating corporate and public sector partners across the country to save energy through commitments and investments.
