Hello Fresh: Reducing Food Waste

HelloFresh, a food-delivery by mail service, has announced a partnership with Pratt Industries, a packaging producer, to deliver all meal kits in 100-percent-postconsumer-recycled content cardboard. This is expected to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 6,800 tons and save more than 115,000 trees in a year. The food service also claims to reduce food waste as foods are picked, packaged and delivered efficiently.



Electric Vehicle State Adoption News

We have been reporting on the growth of Electric Vehicles for a decade and even installed a few EV charging stations over the past year to improve the network of local "fueling" locations. Under a new Executive Order by the governor, the State of Illinois will consider adding some to their fleet, as well as hybrids and high efficiency models of the vehicles they utilize.



Energy Plan Survey Results

Thank you to everyone that participated in the Energy and Conservation Plan survey. The County Board shall consider adoption of the update this month. The results were excellent with the County encouraged to continue to improve our buildings' energy efficiency (70%) and water conservation efforts (66%), improve recycling (84%) and do outreach; by working with other groups and on our own (60%). Support was also expressed for more bike and pedestrian friendly roadways (60%).



Results of Compost Bin Sale

Will County sold Compost Bins for the first time in nearly two decades and is proud to say the sale was a great success, with all 108 bins sold. If you are interested in backyard composting but missed this opportunity to purchase a bin, please know that other types are available through the Conservation Foundation and through many retailers this time of year. Find a plastic container, perhaps one with a lost lid, put a few pebbles in it, fill it with water, and then place it in the back of your toilet, depending on your flushing habits, you can save up to 10 gallons of water per day. By placing a bottle in the toilet tank, less water is needed to fill the tank and therefore less water is being flushed. With water prices rising and shortages in the news, now is a great time to act!

Facebook Fan Question about Old Gasoline

Each spring, as lawn mowers are restarted and we offer our collection events, Facebook fans ask about old gasoline and gasoline/oil mixes. While the mixes must be brought to one of our HHW events or the Regional HHW site, the old gasoline can still be used in a large engine according to the EPA. It can be added to a half full car or truck tank and will be burned as fuel. If you aren't comfortable with this option, please utilize a Household Hazardous Waste event. (Not suitable for small engines)
