Now is the perfect time of year to start a backyard compost! Consider setting aside a few square feet to place leaves, twigs, grass clippings, weeds, and a few food scraps; such as pumpkins, potato peels, apple cores, and banana peels.

Keep these nutrient filled items out of the landfill by mixing them in a bin, a barrel, or just a pile. Turn them occasionally and with a

Everyday more businesses are reducing waste and recycling. Will County has been a leader in this effort for over a decade, with office recycling that includes: all types of office paper, newspaper, cardboard, chipboard (tissue boxes, pen boxes), plastic bottles and containers, aluminum cans, foil, and trays, glass bottles, tin cans, and cartons (milk or juice).

Several County departments take recycling even further, with plastic bags collected at Land Use and taken to a grocery store by an employee that volunteers. The Highway Department recycles asphalt, gravel, and concrete. The **Facilities** Management/Building Maintenance division is known for recycling carpet and shingles when special construct projects arise, as well as fluorescent bulbs whenever they replace them. All the departments recycle electronics, printer cartridges, and rechargeable batteries. Members of the public are actually welcome to recycle rechargeable batteries at several facilities. our

The Land Use is also home to the County's vemicomposting program. There are four bins in offices and in the breakroom offering employees the opportunity to feed red-wiggler worms apple cores, banana peels, broccoli, cauliflower, coffee grounds with filters, and tea bags (to name a few).

Reuse of paper that is used on one side is also done by employees throughout the County. If not reusing it directly, they send it to County Printshop to be made into note pads.

Will County offered six separate HHW (Household Hazardous Waste) Collection Events over the course of 2014, a couple more than usual. They were very successful but if you didn't make it to one of them, please know that the County supports a regional HHW site in Naperville, just off Rt. 59, approximately one mile south of Rt. 88. This facility is open every weekend, except on major holidays and accepts an array of hazardous chemicals. The site does not take calls but a list of items accepted is on our website, click on Household Hazardous Waste under the Green Guide tab for the full list and on our Recycle-It Map for directions.

still make too much, freeze or donate leftovers. Recycle - The aluminum foil and trays often used can be recycled, even if they aren't fully clean. Aluminum is melted at several thousand degrees, it can be recycled with some stains.

Durable instead of Disposable - Use glassware instead of plastics, cloth napkins instead of paper, dish towels instead of paper, plates instead of paper or plastic. Organic - Consider purchasing organic apples, and other fruits and vegetables to reduce pesticide use. Vegetarian - Give a turkey your own presidential pardon or consider serving a free range bird with lots of non-meat sides.

Travel - Stay at home, invite the neighbors or travel in a fuel efficient manner; carpool anyone?
