Recycling Shredded Paper

Shredded paper is challenging to collect at the curb and even more challenging to sort at the Material Recovery Facility (MRF). It may blow, becoming litter in the wind when it is collected. However, once it reaches the sorting floor, it has the ability to turn into non-recoverable confetti.

If you shred paper at home, consider using it for stuffing in packages you mail. If you have a vermicompost bin, the worms will gladly eat it. If you must place it in the recycling, be sure to use paper bags and staple them closed to prevent the shreds from flying either at the curb or in the MRF.
