County Leaders Tour Solar in Joliet

The County Executive's office, County Board, and staff visited IKEA's new warehouse in Joliet that boasts nearly 3MW of rooftop solar capacity, the largest rooftop installation in Illinois. This impressive array will feed the grid in the coming weeks, while offseting a portion of the building's electrical demand via net-metering. Continental Electrical Construction Company and SoCore led the solar tour, discussing their increased solar participation in Illinois and the use of local union labor to get the job done well.

Schools Learn about their Waste

Eight schools located in Joliet, Mokena, Plainfield, Romeovile and Tinley Park have had waste audits this year through the Earth Flag program. They have discovered an abundance of single use items, from packaging to cutlery and want to reduce the waste. The Environmental Educator is assisting schools with finding compostable options and returning to washable, reusable approaches when possible.
