#### **Cease Wasting Water in the Shower**

Waiting for the water to warm is one of the largest ways Americans waste water. There are many ways to reduce the amount of water wasted and help hot water reach us faster! Consider installing a Point-of-Use Tankless Hot Water heater in the bathroom. Insulate your current hot water heater and the hot pipes leading from it to the bathroom(s). For families, take showers one after the other, while the pipes are warm. Keep a bucket in the shower to catch the cold water and use it for plants or to fill the toilet tank!



## **Vacation Souvenirs: Best Options**

We want to bring family and friends souvenirs from our adventures but we also don't want to waste resources on gifts that no one wants or needs. Stuffed animals, shot glasses, key chains, etc may all seem festive but each item takes energy and materials to make and ship. A single cotton T-Shirt requires 713 gallons of water to grow the all-natural, recyclable material. Consider sending a postcard to those back home. It's personal, memorable and recyclable!



**Recycle Plastic Bags at the Grocery Store** 

Even if you are amazing at avoiding plastic grocery bags, it is nearly impossible to avoid grocery items that come in plastic bags! The good news is these are lightweight, reducing fuel usage in transit to your store and home. In addition, these bags can often be recycled at the same grocery store plastic bag collection boxes! They simply need to be clean and dry - such as cereal bags, bread bags, toilet paper roll wrapping, etc. Tell your friends and family so more plastic film is recovered and recycled into new items!



#### **Batteries: What Needs to be Recycled?**

Rechargeable batteries, like the kind in your car, your cell phone, your laptop and power tools NEED to be recycled. They contain heavy metals that can leach into water and cause contamination. However, single use batteries do not contain these metals. Some of them used to contain mercury but this hasn't been the case in nearly 20 years. The County works with Call2Recycle to offer rechargeable battery recycling at a variety of locations, including many libraries. #### **Businesses with Unwanted Electronics**

Since businesses and non-profits are not eligible to participate in the Residential Electronics Collections, they often ask where they can recycle their unwanted items. There are several companies in the area that offer these services. The first thing to do is ask your supplier if they will take back items. Consider leasing options in the future. Be sure to use R2 Certified recyclers and retain certificates of destruction or recycling to prove you handled these items in accordance with the law.

#### A change to the Electronic Recycling Sites


The 2nd and 4th Tuesday from 5pm to 7pm was the City of Joliet time slot for Residential Electronics Recycling since October 2016 but under the City's new contract, many of the electronics can be taken by calling the waste hauler at 800-449-7587. Frankfort Township will be opening on March 13, offering electronics recycling to all Will County residents on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays each month. Services will be offered in the parking lot of 11000 W. Lincoln Hwy., Frankfort 5pm-7pm!



#### Participation at our local Regional HHW Site

While Will County offers four to six one-day Household Hazardous Waste Collection events each year, we also assist in funding one of the four permanent HHW Regional sites in Illinois. The Naperville site, just a few miles north of Will County, is the busiest site in the State and one of the busiest in the United States. Last year, it served 21,404 households!
