EV Charging Station Grants for Enhanced Infrastructure

When people switched from horse drawn carriages to motor cars, they worried about finding fuel stations. The same is true today as we see every auto maker offering Electric Vehicles and Plug-In Hybrids. People want to be assured that they can refuel their vehicle and this requires improvements infrastructure. The amazing part is we already have electricity available everywhere, so now we simply need to add access to it. Will County wants public parking lots in every community to add access. From city halls to libraries and parks. All taxing bodies with public parking are encouraged to apply for



grants to cover part of the costs of installing Level 1 (standard 110/120 volt) and Level 2 (240 volt) charging options. This will encourage employees, residents and tourists to drive CLEAN AIR vehicles in our transportation hub. Application Here.

Water Refill Station Grant for Schools & Parks

Grant for Low Emission School Buses and More

If you are concerned about the pollution from diesel trucks consider urging your school district, company or vendor to take advantage of a federal grant program. The Clean Diesel Grants application deadline is February 26 and offers up to \$44 million total to fund projects that significantly reduce diesel emissions. The current funds can be used for:



- School buses
- Class 5 Class 8 heavy-duty highway vehicles
- Marine engines
- Nonroad engines, equipment or vehicles used in construction, handling of cargo, agriculture, energy production (including stationary generators and pumps).

Composting with Red Wiggler Worms

Food scraps make up a significant portion of our household waste by weight. Many of those scraps are delicious food for worms and in return for you providing them a dark bin under the sink, they will give you a nutrient rich soil amendment. Add a few spoonfuls to houseplants and watch them grow healthier, providing you with cleaner air to breath. Add a

What happens to the curbside recyclables (4th in series)

The final step in the life of our paper and packaging materials is the manufacturer that turns them into new products. Finding items made from recovered materials is easier than you may think. All newspapers have 30% recycled content, most cardboard boxes and chipboard boxes do - read the side of your cereal box, it is usually labeled). All aluminum cans and steel cans have recycled content and glass bottles can contain up to 100% recycled content (but most office Depot® Round-Ring View Binder, don't since we don't recover enough). Plastic is the one item that tends not to have recycled content since it melts at low temperatures that may not kill all the bacteria. When it is made with recycled content, it is layered to protect food. Patagonia is a leading manufacturer of clothing that used recycled pop bottles as the insulating fill. Backpacks, t-shirts, shoes and

more are made with recycled plastic. Plastic decking is far superior to wood as it lasts at least 50 years without maintenance and uses tons of recovered plastic film from bags! Some park benches, outdoor chairs, picnic tables, bumper stops and more are made similarly. Whenever you shop, look for labels and try to purchase items made from recycled content to complete the recycling loop!
