Free Seed Fest from the Unv of IL Master Gardeners



Will County Supports Medication Take-Back for Illinois


House Bill 4888 is being supported by Will County as a means to improve access to proper disposal for unwanted medication. Leftover medications should never be flushed and since 2007 the County has worked with local police and



pharmacies to offer take-back locations to keep medication out of waterways, or unintended people's hands. This legislation requires Pharmaceutical Manufacturers to offer more collection locations and pay for the disposal.

The 50th Anniversary of Earth Day calls for Celebration

A few months ago the Forest Preserve of Will County reached out to the Energy Resource Recovery and Health Division, Will County Department the South and Metropolitan Higher Education Consortium to brainstorm ways we could celebrate the momentous 50th anniversary of Earth Day. The grocery store chain, Aldi, has told all suppliers that they must make all packaging either recyclable, reusable or compostable. The Aldi label will meet these requirements by the end of 2022. All other suppliers must meet these conditions by 2025. They have



offered to work with suppliers to try different approaches and strive for innovation to reduce wasted resources.
