#### Sunny Hill Nursing Home is Paid to go Off-Grid

In 2018, Will County worked with a company, Enel X, to utilize the backup generator at Sunny Hill Nursing Home during times of grid instability. The generator that is in place at the 157 bed nursing home supplies emergency power in the event of a power outage. Enel X started a program called "Demand Response" to use backup generators in events of high demand times, to take energy off of ComEd's power grid. The amount of energy that can be taken off of the grid at Sunny Hill is around 250kW. Demand Response tends to



occur during the summer months as everyone is running their air conditioners but Will County is part of Enel X's Capacity Performance program which is year round. However, the emergency program has been very infrequent having only 1 event over the past 6 years. In return, Will County is paid for helping ComEd reduce the overall strain on their grid. At no time are the residents at Sunny Hill at risk because the generator is fully capable and designed to handle this type of load. The expected total revenue that will be yielded from the Demand Response participation over the course of 5 years is \$43,111.

## **Buying Food Locally may never be Easier!**

Support our farmers, consider purchasing locally grown. Thinking of fruits, vegetables, meat, dairy, herbs, flowers, a pumpkin patch, a pick-your-own farm, vineyards, breweries, or distilleries, you'll find them at "Prairie Bounty of Illinois" online directory. Prairie Bounty, a directory of over 900 farms, businesses and specialty groups across the state, is available online through this link, offered in cooperation between the Illinois Farm Bureau (IFB) and Illinois Specialty Growers Association (ISGA). The Illinois MarketMaker, publishes the "Prairie Bounty of Illinois" online directory. This Prairie Bounty directory features an





interactive map that contains the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of Illinois farms and businesses who market through pick-your own, roadside markets, farmers markets, farm stands, CSAs, and wholesale.

The <u>American Forest & Paper Association</u> (AF&PA) reported that U.S. tissue mills recently set record-high levels of tissue production. U.S. tissue mills manufactured about **700,000 tons of tissue in March alone**. Not all paper rolls are made with recovered paper, so chose wisely to support recycling and literately, save a tree!



## Clean Energy Bills in Springfield!
