10,000 Trees being planted at Rock Creek Farm in Peotone

Exciting things are happening on Will County farms! Rock Creek Farm in Peotone has partnered with the Savanna Institute, Midwest Agroforestry Solutions, Healing Soils Foundation, and the USDA-NRCS to plant 10,000 trees. This kickstarted an agroforestry project funded through the Natural Resource Conservation Service's (NRCS) Conservation Reserve Program. A windbreak has been established, consisting of 25 species of trees, planted in 8 rows, which will improve soil and water



retention, reduce erosion and protect organic crops from pesticide drift. So far, they have planted 9,000 trees saplings!

Girl Scouts create garden in New Lenox Commons

The Village of New Lenox has a beautiful new Butterfly Way Station Garden thanks to **Aubrey Jackson**, **Lauren McGreal**, **Sydney Rinker**, and **Megan Trevarthan** of Girl Scout Troop 125. Planning began a year ago when the girls (4th and 5th grade) were searching for projects to earn the Bronze Award. Once the garden was selected, they met with Master Gardener, Nancy Kuhujda from the Unv of IL Extension Office who taught the girls about the importance of Monarch butterflies and helped the girls develop a garden plan. They proposed the project to Mayor Tim Baldermann, who approved it for the prestigious center of the community. In June, the Public Works department



helped prepare the ground. The garden habitat is now registered online in the National Way Station Registry as a Certified Butterfly Way Station.

Thanks for supporting the Textile & Home Goods Event

A record breaking 34,752 pounds of material was collected over the 5 day event at the County Building. When this event first launched in 2005, only gym shoes were accepted. All shoes were taken the following year. In 2010 the County added one day for small home goods. This became the norm for most of the remaining years, until this year. Postponed due to COVID, held in July instead of May, with a contractor (Helping Hands) able to staff a truck each day in the parking lot, we witnessed an unprecedented response. We nearly tripled last year's total, which was our highest ever! Congratulations to all that participated and kept these items out of the landfill. Requests for a second event are being considered but to be done on a Saturday morning at different location.



Food Insecurity during COVID

The Will County GIS department partnered with the Health Department, Northern Illinois Food Bank and other community organizations to address real needs during this pandemic. There have been disruptions to the food chain due to infections at meat processing facilities, transportation problems with reports of dairy


