In 2019, 35% of all residential waste in Will County was recycled. Recycle in your curbside bin only the items named below and check with your municipality or hauler to see if there are exceptions to these guidelines.

Recycle: Clean Paper & Cardboard, Aluminum & Steel Cans, Glass Bottles & Jars and **SOME Plastics.** There are so many types of plastic out there. Many are marked with a recycling symbol, but NOT all are recyclable in today's markets. **NEVER put plastic gloves, masks, or plastic bags in your curbside recycling bin. They are garbage.**

Recycle ONLY these plastics: Bottles, Tubs, Jugs & Jars.

Solar Energy Becoming a Reality in Will County

Will County warehouses, schools, restaurants, and homes are going solar. Since 2018, <u>unincorporated</u> <u>residential permits</u> have shown continued growth in this green energy sector. There have been **231** residential solar permits applied for thus far. Will County achieved Gold Status under the SolSmart program for its efforts to eliminate barriers to going solar.



The current solar energy excitement is in part due to countywide public forums called Solarize Chicagoland. These workshops, held at libraries and public buildings, are giving residents an understanding of how they can take advantage of solar energy in this area. Presenters explain the access to installers and the benefits of group purchasing power. Other incentives such as the Illinois State Renewable Energy Credits, the Federal Tax credit, and Net Metering are also discussed.

The 2019 Solarize Chicagoland was a huge success! There were over 135 participants that signed contracts for the program, including 8 Will County unincorporated residents. Solarize Chicagoland's newly-installed solar arrays will offset emissions equivalent to approximately 800,000 pounds of coal burned. Collectively, customers will save an estimated \$98,300 on electric bills in the first year alone. The 2020 Solarize Chicagoland Program is going strong. Watch for upcoming forums in your area.

The Will County Land Use Department, Resource Recovery & Energy (RR & E) Division provides inspections of Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) permitted solid waste sites for compliance and enforces the cleanup of open dump sites in Will County. Since 2015, through a Delegation Agreement with the IEPA, the RR & E Division has enforced the cleanup of 77,267 cubic yards of waste while inspecting IEPA permitted sites such as: Landfills, Transfer Stations, Compost sites, Construction & Demolition Recycling Facilities, Clean Construction & Demolition Debris and Uncontaminated Soil Fill Operations, amongst others.
