## Recyclepalooza & HHW Event

Since 2007 the ShareFest organization has partnered with Will County to offer an array of reuse and recycling options on the second Saturday of September. This event requires an appointment due to its popularity.

For those unfamiliar, now is the time to clean out the garage, basement and closets. We have six stations in one location to accept (in this order):

- **Electronics** - all sizes of TVs (limit 2 per vehicle), computers, monitors, mice, keyboards, game devices, satellite dishes, CDs, DVDs, Zip Drives, UPS devices, Printers, CD/DVD players, Boomboxes, Radios, Digital Clocks, Microwaves, Cameras, String Lights, Scanners, Calculators, Telephones/Cell Phones, Power Tools, Hair Dryers, Digital Photo Frames and much more.
- **Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)** - all Automotive Fluids, Mercury and mercury containing items, all types of Paint (limit 15 gallons), Pool Chemicals, Cleaners, all sizes of Fluorescent Lights (limit 15), Rechargeable Batteries, Pesticides, Fertilizers, and hand held Gas Cylinders.
- **Foam Polystyrene** - foam egg cartons, meat trays, coolers, packaging, cups, etc.

Will County is offering two separate one-day Saturday collection events for Electronics and Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) that require appointments.

We ask participants to pack their vehicles recognizing that electronics will be taken out first and hazardous items taken second.

These events are offered for residential materials only (no business waste).

Please pack the vehicle to be unloaded in this order:

- **Electronics** - all sizes of TVs (limit 2 per vehicle), computers, monitors, mice, keyboards, game devices, satellite dishes, CDs, DVDs, Zip Drives, UPS devices, Printers, CD/DVD players, Boomboxes, Radios, Digital Clocks, Microwaves, Cameras, String Lights, Scanners, Calculators, Telephones/Cell Phones, Power Tools, Hair Dryers, Digital Photo Frames and much more.

## Will County's Recycling Specialist Nationally Recognized

Marta Keane, Will County's Recycling Specialist since March of 2006, was honored to receive national recognition from the Product Stewardship Institute for her work in promoting and passing statewide legislation to improve recycling and safe disposal of difficult materials. She has served as the Chair of the Illinois Product Council for nearly ten years. Over the past 19 years, Marta has been a leader advancing Manufacturer funded Electronics Recovery and Recycling, Pharmaceutical Take-Back, and Paint Recycling. She has also worked on improvements to Battery recovery and recycling, and traditional recycling. With each statewide law passed the residents of Will County have benefited from improved service levels and lower costs. This award was shared with the leaders of the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO) and the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County (SWANCC) that comprise the Illinois team leadership.

## Act Now for a Clean Energy Tax Credit

If you plan to increase your insulation, install rooftop solar, or complete other energy projects in your home, now is the best time to do so. The federal Energy Efficient Home Improvement Credit (\$1,200) and the Clean Energy Tax Credit (up to \$2,000) are available for home energy projects **completed by December 31, 2025**. If you typically owe federal taxes, these credits can reduce your tax bill in 2026.



Using more efficient appliances at home can help lower your utility bills, keep your home comfortable, and reduce pollution. The next time you are looking to replace your refrigerator, water heater, TV, or any other appliance, find efficient models by:

- Looking for [ENERGY STAR](#)- and [WaterSense](#)-labeled models
- Comparing yellow [EnergyGuide](#) [labels](#)
- Seeing which models qualify for [ComEd](#) or [Nicor](#) rebates
- Researching efficiency ratings (SEER2, IEER, COP) for different models

## Reduce Water Waste to Save

Residents tend to see water bills increase in the hot summer months. Up to 50% of outdoor water use is wasted due to evaporation, wind, or runoff due to overwatering. Avoid losing extra water by watering in the early morning and evening. If the lawn springs back up when you step on it, it does not need water. Check for leaks in your irrigation systems and sprinkler heads, and direct water to the lawn instead of sidewalks and pathways.

## Green Back-to-School Shopping

As you shop for back-to-school supplies, consider purchasing products made from recycled materials or from sustainable sources. You might even find items that have never been used at local thrift stores.



Refillable mechanical pencils have some company, with refillable dry erase markers such as the [Pilot V Board Master](#) or [Auspen](#). The [Stabilo Boss](#) is an example of a refillable highlighter. Permanent markers such as those from [Pilot](#) can be refilled. Refillable acrylic markers are also available from brands like [Montana](#).

Refillable binders made from paperboard or recycled materials can be filled with recycled notepaper. A few more examples:

- Standard pencils made from recycled newspaper, like [these from Amber and Rose](#).
- [Decomposition](#) notebooks, sketchbooks, and filler paper are made from 100% Post-Consumer Recycled (PCR) paper.
- They also offer refillable ball-point pens made from 90% PCR plastic and three-ring binders made from 85% PCR plastic.
- 100% PCR printer paper is available, such as that from Printworks, [AbilityOne](#), or [Target](#).
- [ACCO](#) paper clips contain 90% recycled materials, 50% of which is PCR.

Online shopping or in-person, if you cannot find options, ask the business to stock more sustainable items.
