\$5 for Thermostats ends 10/15

Last September, in an effort to increase energy efficiency and reduce mercury in our homes, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) and the Product Stewardship Institute (PSI) launched a year-long pilot project that offers Illinois residents and small heating and cooling contractors easy, convenient locations for dropping off their mercury-containing thermostats. In exchange for each thermostat returned, participating hardware stores (True Value and Ace) will provide a \$5 coupon that can be used at that store.

Back to School Waste-Free Lunch

Packing a lunch for ourselves is hard enough, packing for our kids can be more challenging. Begin with a durable, reusable lunch bag. Place a folded, cloth napkin inside. If utensils are needed, avoid plastic and send the real fork or spoon. Skip single serving packs. Instead, place small amounts from larger containers into reusable, washable containers. For instance, quart yogurt in 6 ounce servings, 20 pretzels or chips from a 16 ounce bag. Refillable water bottle for beverage. Ask your child to bring home whatever they don't eat. This gives you a chance to change items they don't like or them a chance to eat the left overs as an after school snack!

NuWay Switches to Natural Gas!

Homewood - NuWay opened the area's first **public** compressed natural gas (CNG) fueling station in early August 2016. The station allows any vehicle that runs on compressed natural gas to easily refuel. Just outside of Will County, at 1501 W. 175th Street, near Halsted Ave. and Interstate 80, it offers a convenient stop for the area's busy transportation corridor.



Homewood Disposal began its commitment to cleaner fuel in 2012 when it first added CNG trucks to its fleet. For easy fleet fueling, Homewood Disposal installed a private CNG filling at its Park Forest location. Today, it has over 60 trucks running on CNG and is committed to continued CNG growth. Some benefits of using Compressed Natural Gas fuel include:

- * It is colorless, odorless, non-toxic, and emits nearly 90% fewer emissions than diesel.
- * CNG is domestically produced and readily available.
- * Natural gas vehicles can reduce noise by as much as 50% compared to diesel vehicles.
- * Natural gas prices are more stable than diesel and gas.

* Natural gas vehicles are less likely to have a spill because the storage tanks are stronger
