Greenest Super Bowl in History!

The City of Phoenix Public Works Department reached a milestone by having a zero waste Super Bowl. An event is defined as zero waste for diverting 90% of the waste away from landfill's by recycling and composting. The 2023 Super Bowl diverted 92% of the waste away from land fills. "We see this as a huge, historic win," said Lorizelda Stoeller, Deputy Public Works Director and Chair of the Super Bowl Steering Committee Green Initiatives group. "This took a lot of planning ahead of time to educate the public on separating trash from recyclables. " 81 tons of material was recycled from this years event.
