Nearly everyone has some left over paint taking up space in the basement, garage, shed or storage closet. Most of this paint is latex meaning it is water based and nonhazardous. While most of us are glad it isn't hazardous, it comes as a surprise to many that it is not taken at a hazardous waste collection event.

Latex paint can be recycled or it can be dried out and discarded with the refuse. To recycle it, residents take it to Ace hardware and pay a fee based on the amount (\$2.50 per gallon currently).

# Lemont Home in National TV Show!

The Chicago Regional Council of Carpenters (CRCC) is spearheading "The Green Home," a stateof-the-art construction project in Lemont. "The



Green Home" is an environmentally friendly, energy-efficient home designed for modern comfort and convenience, yet built to challenge the natural elements. Factor in cost-saving, innovative products and the CRCC is raising the bar on construction. One of the goals with building "The Green Home" is to not only comply with the U.S. Department of Energy's Builders Challenge and the U.S. Green Building Council rating system, but advance beyond conventional construction standards.

In a 13-episode series produced by the CRCC in partnership with Lakeshore Public Television, viewers are taken through the construction of a five-bedroom house with an open floor plan that features energy-efficient and sustainable insulated concrete forms (ICFs), a dashboard of residential controls to regulate all lighting, heating, ventilation, air conditioning, appliances, security and other systems with a touch of the finger on a smartphone or device resulting in convenience, energy efficiency and safety benefits. The series will feature skilled carpenters and complementary trades constructing and installing an array of energy-efficient features. The house will use a radiant heat system, which is more efficient than baseboard and forced-air heating systems. High-efficiency light bulbs and smart appliances will be throughout and "The Green Home" will use highly insulated R-5 windows, the top-of-the-line energyefficient windows. Outside the home, a rainwater retention system will be installed. By capturing rainwater, it can be used for watering gardens or agriculture.

less costly and currently, there is legislation making its way through Springfield to do just that!

House Bill 5457 creates the Paint Stewardship Act. The goal is place the cost of recycling on manufacturers, creating a network of oil-based and latex paint takeback sites throughout Illinois without a user fee. This is also expected to allow Will County to be reimbursed for costs associated from taking paint at collection events.

The legislation is considered Product Stewardship and has many additional benefits. It is expected to reduce disposal, create jobs, cut government costs and increase services to consumers.

The Energy Improvement and Extension Act (H.R. 1424) offers a tax credit of 30% to homeowners who install a geothermal (ground source heat pump) system on their property. The property must be residential but does not need to be primary residence. (The credit excludes systems used solely for swimming pools and/or hot tubs.) The 30% tax credit counts toward the heat pump, ground loop and related equipment. Labor costs for excavation and installing the loopfield, installing the heat pump, and any other plumbing, wiring and/or ducting needed to make the system work are also included. The system must meet or exceed Energy Star requirements. The credit was capped at \$2,000, the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 eliminated the cap. You can install a Geosystem and take full advantage of the 30% tax credit! This legislation is good for installations placed into service from January 1, 2009 through December 31, 2016.

#### Copy greener!

Last month emphasized the Will County Circut Courts efforts to become paperless. However, printing needs remain and the County's internal print shop has been "greening" the way for years.



Recently, Michael Thompson, Records Management Director, reported on the paper purchasing.

The vast majority of paper used by Records Management and purchased for use by other departments in their printers, copiers and fax machines is:

- Made from 30% post-consumer recycled fiber.
- From a SFI Certified Source (third party verification of sustainable forestry practices).
- Made with Elemental Chlorine Free (ECF) virgin fiber content.
- Manufactured under alkaline (acid-free) conditions.
- In compliance with the North American governmental standard for post-consumer recycled fiber.

Beyond the paper, Thompson explained, "We are in the process of reducing the environmental impact of our finishing options by providing more environmentally conscious choices. Last year we added a stand-alone tape binder that triples the number of pages that can be bound using 100% recyclable binding tape. And with the addition of our new booklet maker (which uses a couple staples), we are beginning to drastically reduce the number of items that need to be bound using plastic combs and metal/plastic coils" These efforts enhance recycling and reduce waste.

Thompson continued, "We began the year by upgrading the Print Shop with new production printers that use less energy while producing higher quality prints up to 25% faster than the machines they replaced. Our new Oce VP6160 Ultra uses 179.334 kWh less to produce a 2 million print run than its closest
