Over the past six months, Will County staff and a consulting firm (funded through federal ARRA) have taken on the job of overhauling Zoning and Building Codes that have not been comprehensively reviewed in 30 years. The zoning and building codes determine what can be built, where and how. The public's input in this effort is now needed. The proposed codes are viewable

The Will County Green Team has been diligently working on Energy Management Procedures for many county office buildings. These procedures are intended to provide the County with



additional energy and equipment purchase savings. Some of the proposed procedures may include consolidation of office equipment and turning off computers, printers, and lights when they are not needed. Additionally, employees may be asked to limit their use of personal coffee pots and appliances. If allowed, selected buildings may lower or raise temperatures a few degrees to save energy based on the season.

Nothing tastes better than when it is packaged in glass. At least that is what the Glass Packaging Institute likes to say. Regardless of your preference, glass recycling has been part of glass manufacturing since glass was made.

Broken glass is part of the recipe and glass bottles can be made of up to 100% recycled content! Most never get that high because recovery of glass remains low. In Northern Illinois, we have access to glass markets unavailable in some regions of the U.S. Be certain you are recycling your glass bottles and jars. All colors (clear, green, brown & blue) are accepted.

However, some people get confused. Please DO NOT include vases, windows or drinking glasses. Donate them if they are still in usable condition!
