
Front-Door collection is available for all electronics accepted. There is a fee of \$40 per TV and up to 10 additional items (excluding televisions) at no addition charge.

Solid Waste Plan Update -Comment Period Opens July 25!

Will County has been working on an update to our Solid Waste Plan for the past six months. It is being released today for Public Comment. The last plan had a goal of 40% diversion, and we have achieved over that, averaging 43% in the most recent year calculated. The new plan includes continued involvement in the IEPA enforcement program, increasing the goal to 55% diversion by 2022 and encouraging more residential and commercial recycling, along with expansion of food composting programs. The Plan is available on the willcountygreen.com website and comments will be accepted for 90 days.



Will County Recognized for Solar Friendliness

In June, Will County became the first SolSmart designated community in the State of Illinois. SolSmart is a national designation and technical assistance program that recognizes leading solar communities and empowers additional communities to expand their local solar markets. Funded by the U.S. Department of Energy, SolSmart strives to cut red tape, drive greater solar deployment, and



make it possible for even more American homes and businesses to access solar energy to meet their electricity needs. As a SolSmart Bronze designee, Will County is receiving national recognition for adopting programs and practices that make it faster and easier to go solar.

Green that "Doggie Bag"

Recycled products that contain post-consumer waste use less resources to produce. Fold-Pak has four GRA-Endorsed take-out containers, which all contain 100% recycled content, at least 35% post-consumer waste, and are processed chlorine free.



Visit the local Farmers Markets

A farmers market adds economic value to the local community. It educates consumers and farmers, bringing health and social benefits to those it serves. By its very nature, it promotes the consumption of fresh, locally grown products. In addition, many farmers markets accept the Illinois LINK card which greatly expands fresh food options for residents with low incomes. Small, local farmers are able to grow a wider variety of plants and foods through the sale of their goods directly to the public. Aug 6-12 is National Farmer's Market Week!



Ditch the Straw (and all single use plastic)

Waste Reduction means being more considerate of the items we purchase. One item we tend to take for granted is the straw.
