- Household Hazardous Materials (Motor Oil, Paint, Pesticides, Driveway Sealant, Mercury, Fluorescent Lights, etc.)
- Propane Tanks, Cylinders and Fire Extinguishers
- Electronics (TV, Computer, VCR, Printer, Camera, etc.)
- Foam Plastic (meat trays, block, clamshells, no peanuts)
- Wood (plain, painted, stained, treated, with or without nails)
- Scrap Metal (keys, hangers, siding, brake rotors and drums, chassis parts, pipes, wires, metal rods, broken hinges, etc.)
- Clothing, home goods (furniture reuse, drapes, blankets, etc)
- Books

Plan to spend an hour and donate some blood, listen to a presentation, or touch a fire engine. Please, remember to bring a donation for the food pantry. The Village of New Lenox churches and over 50 other organizations have joined together to offer a long list of ways for the community to assist one another and the environment. 


Tire Recycling Event

Will County Fairgrounds, Peotone

Friday & Saturday, Oct 26 & 27 8am-3pm

Will County shall host a tire recycling collection event in October. This event is being paid for by Will County and is open to Will County residents and farmers only. In some past years, the State of Illinois has funded such collections to prevent tire fires and reduce mosquito breeding areas. When a tire is purchased in Illinois, a fee is charged to recycle the old tire, regardless of the customer exchanging one. Based on this law, tires should not be accumulating on anyone's property. If you have some, on or off the rim, bring them to this event.

- ID with address is required
- Accepted tires: auto, small truck and farm tires
- NO business tires, industrial tires or off road tires
- NO heavily soiled tires; they will be rejected
- Participants must be able to unload their tires

IKEA Goes Solar

Over the course of this year, the IKEA store in Bolingbrook has been installing solar panels on its roof. In June, they began drawing power from the 4,784 panels. This made the Will County IKEA the largest solar power owner in the state. As a corporation, they are installing solar panels at stores across the country as part of their sustainability goals.



New Lenox Township Expands Recycling

New Lenox Township is not only helping to fund the HHW collection during Sharefest; they are also operating an Electronics and Traditional Recycling Drop-Off site year round! As if this doesn't keep them busy enough, they have added Motor Oil, Antifreeze, Propane Tanks and Fire Extinguishers to their list. The motor oil cannot contain gasoline or other fluids. Likewise, the antifreeze needs to be free of other contaminants.
