Will County Cuts Paper Use!

The Will County Board has begun its transition to a paperless meeting environment. The goal is to communicate and conduct the meeting of the Will County



Board and its committees in an entirely digital format by Dec 1, 2014. As of November 30, 2014 the County Board Administrative Office will no longer provide paper agenda copies.

Prior to the transition to "board management software" an estimated 30,000+ sheets of paper were used per month for committee agendas, county board agendas and additional correspondence that was distributed to board members. That figure has now dropped to under 7,500 sheets and will continue to decrease once everyone has become accustomed to the system. This change has also decreased the amount of envelopes, discs and mailers that were used to deliver the agendas each month.
